

Sea Scout Ship 25 History

THE SHIP - in 1910, Lord Baden Powell, founder of the Boy Scouts, at the urging of his brother Warrington decided to combine the best attributes of seamanship with the character training of Boy Scouts and created Sea Scouts in England. In 1912, Sea Scouting came to America. Today, Sea Scouts is world-wide and has been coed in the United States since the 1970's.

Based on Lake Cayuga in New York's Finger Lakes, Ship 25 focuses on sailing, paddlecraft, and scuba diving from late Spring to early Fall. In the cooler months, we camp, hike, climb mountains and even go skiing. When travel is not a concern we participate in land- and water-based training with other Sea Scouts from all over the Northeast.

Ithaca, NY has been the base for a number of ships and SSS Spear, Ship 25 is by far the longest-lived. It was first organized in the 1920's and has operated several boats over the years, including Lucy T (a former WWII motor launch) and the Spear (a 33' Newport sailboat). The Ship made many long trips, up the lake to the Eire Canal, and then onward. In 1939 we cruised to the Worlds Fair and participated as part of the Scout Service Corps. In 1940, 1941 and 1943 the ship earned Regional Flagship honors.

The Spear eventually disbanded in the 1980's before being resurrected in 2010.

Membership Fee:

As of August 2022, all registered members under age 21 pay \$81 annually. Those age 21 and above pay \$51. This covers BSA's national registration and insurance. All new members in Scouting pay a one time fee of \$25 to the BSA. A scout's uniform and book are the responsibility of each scout's family. Awards and badges will be covered by fundraising. Scout Life Magazine is available for \$15. Each scout is expected to participate in the annual Popcorn Sale and other unit fundraisers. The cost of other activities is assessed to the participants.

Activity Highlights

Sailing, Motorboats & Canoes/Kayaks

We sail on Cayuga Lake aboard our 33' Newport sailboat the "Sensei." Depending on planned activities we may sail for an afternoon, evening, overnight, or for multiple days.

We have taken trips through the inter-lake canal from Seneca to Cayuga Lakes. Going through the lock system can lead all the way through the Erie Canal to the Atlantic Ocean.

We have canoed on the Tioughnioga River from Whitney Point to Chenango Bridge, and on Fall Creek between Freeville and Cornell University.

Switzerland, Italy, Austria, Liechtenstein and Iceland

We have camped, hiked, gone whitewater rafting, paragliding and canyoning in the Swiss Alps through Scouting's International High Adventure Base in Kandersteg Switzerland. Side trips to Italy, Liechtenstein and Austria provided cultural opportunities before we spent several days in Iceland.

Puerto Rico Trips

We have enjoyed two trips to Puerto Rico with a combination sailing and cultural trip. We visited the rainforest, Arecibo Observatory, historic forts, Old San Juan, and sailed aboard a 50' catamaran off the coast to two islands where we went snorkeling. We have gone caving and enjoyed visiting with Sea Scouts from Arecibo.

Scotland

Six of our members have attended the Blair Athol Jamborette, a gathering of around 1200 Scouts from around the world at the Blair Athol Castle in Scotland.

Summer Camp

Sea Scouts have attended Camp Barton learning skills like Small Boat Sailing, Jet Ski use, Lifesaving, First Aid, earning their NYS Boater License, & much more.

National Jamboree

In 2013 and 2017 Ship 25 was part of the Baden-Powell Council contingent to the National Scouting Jamboree at the Summit Bechtel Reserve in West Virginia.

BSA's Florida Sea Base

We have made 3 trips to the Florida Keys to go sailing and Scuba Diving for a Week.

Ocean Sailing/Mountain Climbing

We have sailed on the Atlantic and done an overnight canoe trip in Maine. Plus we've climbed Mt. Monadnock & Mt. Washington in NH.

Regattas and Camporees plus Year Round Camping

Sea Scouts have attended numerous area camporees and plan activities year-round including the year-round camping program.

Regular Meetings

Ship 25 meets most Fridays at 6:30 at the Ithaca Coast Guard Auxiliary Base, subject to the schedule on our calendar posted at www.ithacaseascouts.org. Meetings focus on teaching boating safety and other important skills so we can have fun on the water, experience fellowship, have a chance at leadership, while participating in an advancement program designed to show that you have the skills to lead others safely while having a fun time out on the water.

When circumstances require, we have held meetings via zoom or socially distanced outside.

Sea Scouts is for families

Sea Scout ships are staffed entirely by volunteer parents & adults and every family counts. Training and support allow each parent to be successful. We have lots of fun!

Adults can help:

- drive and supervise for events including sailing, service projects, camping, training, and more
- help with fundraisers
- Adult volunteers should plan to take youth protection training each calendar year at my.scouting.org and provide a completion certificate.

Recognition

Ship 25 has received the Northeast Region Commodore's Award of Excellence for several years in a row. Four of our youth attained the highest rank in Sea Scouts, the Quartermaster. Youth can also earn the Venturing Awards till age 21, and Scouts BSA who are at least 13 and have attained First Class can earn ranks including Eagle and Eagle Palms until they turn 18.

Advanced Training

Several Sea Scout youth have participated in the National Youth Leadership Training, NAYLE - National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience, Sea Scout SEAL training, and the Seabadge Advanced Leadership Course. Additional training is provided by the Ithaca Coast Guard Auxiliary, the Power Squadron.
